#### WHO WE ARE

- Independent, nonpartisan statewide coalition
- Convene, mobilize, support, and empower partners to advance equitable policies that reduce health disparities, prevent chronic disease, and promote health

### REQUEST

 Endorse a request for \$17 million in recurring funds for tobacco use prevention programs, including e-cigarette use prevention

#### Because:

- Smoking is a major cause of cardiovascular disease (CVD), which is the single largest cause of death in the US.
- Even people who smoke fewer than 5 cigarettes per day may show signs of early CVD.
- Smoking causes one out of three deaths from CVD.
- Exposure to secondhand smoke causes heart disease in non-smokers.

#### TOBACCO USE IN NC

- 35.5% of high school students use e-cigarettes
- 2,700 youth under 18 become new daily smokers each year
- 18.5% of adults smoke
- 14,200 adults die each year from their own smoking
- 180,000 youth under 18 in NC will ultimately die prematurely from smoking
- \$3.81 billion in annual healthcare costs directly caused by smoking
- \$931.4 million in Medicaid costs caused by smoking
- \$4.24 billion in smoking-caused productivity losses



#### **FUNDING**

- Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement
  - 1998 settlement
  - 46 states including NC
  - Annual payments in perpetuity
  - Primary purpose is to decrease youth smoking and promote public health
  - Approximately \$140 million each year
- Cigar Tax Revenue
  - Estimated \$25.2 million FY 2022-23
