State of the State of Stroke Care: Highlights

- Stroke Belt Consortium formed in 1994: strokebelt.org
- Justus-Warren Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention Task Force established 1995
- Tri-State Network (NC,SC, GA) formed in 2001
- Stroke Advisory Council established 2006 to advise on Stroke
 System of Care
- Submitted Recommendations to Legislature for a System of Stroke Care (2007)
- NC Stroke Care Collaborative Received Coverdell Stroke Program
 Funds 2002-2012: 60 hospitals participated; between 2005-2012
 89,413 stroke cases enrolled; proportion of patients receiving
 defect-free care improved from 52% to 79%



State of the State of Stroke Care: Highlights

- Provided Health Care Provider Training
- Implemented Acute Care and EMS Quality Improvement Initiatives
- Increased Public Awareness: 2008-12 received funding for education campaigns
- Received ASTHO Grant to Develop NC Stroke Plan (2010)
- Obtained Primary Stroke Center Legislation (2013)
- Developed and Conducted Stroke Prevention Campaigns (2019, 2020)
- Developed NC Stroke System of Care (2019)




Stroke Advisory Council's Guiding Principles

- Incorporate a regionally-based, locally-determined approach within the development of a statewide system of care.
- Support use of science-based practices.
- Use transparent, objective, evidence-based criteria to monitor and evaluate system performance.
- Use consensus-based decision making in system development and implementation.
- Ensure effective interaction and collaboration among all entities.
- Avoid legislative approaches that impose a one-size-fits-all solution and include unfunded mandates.



NC Stroke System of Care

The Stroke Advisory Council works to link communities and health systems to facilitate care coordination and to increase capacity for providing quality stroke care. Therefore, the Stroke Advisory Council developed NC Stroke System of Care Strategies to support efforts to prevent strokes; increase access to care; increase quality, coordinated care; enhance recovery from stroke; and advocate for the prevention and management of stroke.



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NC Stroke System of Care

Purpose: strengthen Stroke System of Care and guide Stroke Advisory Council work

Goals:

- 1. Guide efforts to increase access to care
- 2. Increase quality, coordinated care
- 3. Enhance post-stroke care
- 4. Prevent strokes
- 5. Advocate for stroke prevention and care
