Terminology

 <u>Hubs</u>: A licensed healthcare facility within the state of North Carolina providing neurological telehealth consultations to <u>spoke</u> healthcare facilities

• **Distributed Spokes**: Spokes that receive telestroke services from sources other than North Carolina hospitals

Progress

- September 2016: Anna Bess Brown asked stroke coordinators of known hubs to provide a list of spokes within their network
- Between September 2016
 – February 2017: All other licensed healthcare facilities within North Carolina were contacted to ascertain telestroke status
 - Includes hospitals and free-standing emergency departments






Locations of Hospitals and Free-standing Emergency Departments within North Carolina, classified by Telestroke Network Status




Stroke Discharges per 1,000 Residents








Cerebrovascular deaths per 100,000 residents by county.

Summary

- Of the 100 counties in North Carolina, 54 are non-metropolitan and therefore eligible for Medicare reimbursement of telemedicine services.
- Of non-metropolitan counties, 20 (37.7%) do not have either a hospital or free-standing ED affiliated with a telestroke network
 - over half (11 of 20) of these have no hospital within the county
- There are 35 counties that do not have a certified stroke center or a hospital contracting with a telestroke providers.
- There are no hospitals or free-standing EDs in 19 counties.
