IV. Presentation:

Thanks again to our June Panelists who discussed 2024 AHA/ASA Performance and Quality Measures for Spontaneous Intracerebral Hemorrhage: Pat Aysse, AHA; Eli Johnson, Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist, Michelle Comp, Novant Health Thomasville, and Erin Lewis, UNC Rex.

August Panel: **Vagus Nerve Stimulation** presented by Michelle Geroleman, Stroke Program Patient Navigator, and **Amber Lewis**, Supervisor of Outpatient Rehab Services, from **WakeMed**; and **Karmesh Patel, DPT** from **Cone Health**.

Michelle and Amber presented WakeMed's process for planning, training, implementing, and marketing the new Stroke VNS Rehab Program. See their slides. Karmesh shared that Cone was the first hospital in NC to offer VNS early in 2023.

VNS is only meant for chronic ischemic stroke patients at least 6-months post stroke.

There is no upper limit on how long ago eligible patients experienced stroke; it could have been years ago. Challenges include that using VNS is new for stroke, insurance approval can take time, and VNS requires intense rehab.

Medicare covers stroke VNS rehab.

Q: Is VNS available to the pediatric population?

A: Not that we know of. Ischemic strokes are more common in adults.

Q: Are there better outcomes if the procedure is done soon after the original stroke?

A: Not necessarily.

Q: Does the patient have to go in person to all of the therapy appointments?

A: Yes; the physical therapist directly stimulates the patient's brain during rehab.

Q: Is there is a center in TN that provides VNS therapy?

A: Unknown. See resources in slides for more info.
